#1/1 Connecticut (15-0, 2-0) vs. DePaul (13-4, 1-2)

HUSKIES RETURN TO GAMPTEL TO FACE DEPAUL:

No. 1/1 Connecticut will close will return to Gampel Pavilion Tuesday for the first time since Dec. 3 as it plays host to DePaul in its BIG EAST home opener.

The Huskies boast a 5-1 all-time record against DePaul and have won each of the last five meetings overall by an average of 10.2 pgg.

UConn has not lost to the Blue Demons since the first meeting between the programs on Dec. 28, 1983 - when it dropped a 70-64 decision in Miami, Fla.

The Huskies swept a pair of games from DePaul last season, included in that was one of the most exciting finishes to a regular season game in recent memory. The Huskies needed a steal by Maya Moore and a coast-to-coast dash for a score by Ketia Swanier with less than a minute remaining to escape Chicago with a 77-76 decision over DePaul on March 1, 2008. Connecticut completed the two-game sweep with a convincing 86-67 win in the 2008 BIG EAST Quarterfinals.

UConn will continue its two-game BIG EAST homestand with a game against Syracuse at the XL Center in Hartford on Jan. 17 in a 2:00 p.m. (ET) tip.

UConn enters Tuesday's game a perfect 15-0 and looking for its second consecutive 16-0 start to a season and its seventh since 1994-95.

31 IN A ROW AT HOME: Connecticut has won 31 consecutive regular-season home games - the nation's longest active streak.

UConn's last home loss during the regular season came at the hands of a 70-64 loss vs. Tennessee on Jan. 6, 2007.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM MORGANTOWN: A few notes from the Huskies' 85-55 win over West Virginia on Jan. 10:

- UConn starts a season 15-0 for the second consecutive year and seventh time since 1994-95.

- UConn opens BIG EAST play 2-0 for the 13th consecutive season.

- UConn improves to 211-83 all-time in games played in the month of January and has won each of its last 17 games played during the calendar's first month.

- Renee Montgomery's 28 points moved her past Swin Cash into 10th place on the UConn career scoring list with her current total of 1,603.

- Tina Charles' eight points moved her past Kris Lamb into 25th place on the UConn career scoring list with her current total of 1,247.

- Renee Montgomery has scored 20 or more points in three of her last four games overall.

- Renee Montgomery's 28 points marked her career-best scoring effort against a BIG EAST opponent besting her previous top effort of 27 vs. Cincinnati on Jan. 19, 2008.

- Renee Montgomery joins Svetlana Abrosimova and Shea Ralph as the only players in UConn history to rank among the program's top-10 in scoring, steals and assists.

THE LAST OF THE UNDEFEATED: UConn enters Tuesday's game vs. DePaul as one of only four teams nationally remaining team nationally without a loss at 15-0.

The other remaining teams without a loss are Auburn, North Carolina and Kansas State.

THE NATION'S MOST EXPERIENCED PLAYER: Connecticut point guard **Renee Montgomery** began the 2008-09 season as arguably the nation's most experienced player - and when you look at the numbers there is no argument.

Montgomery enters Tuesday's game vs. DePaul with **124** career starts - the most of any player nationally - and **eight** more than the next closest player, **Oklahoma's Courtney Paris (116)**.

In addition, Montgomery also owns a streak of **117** consecutive starts - also the highest number nationally.

BREAKING DOWN THE REGULAR SEASON WIN STREAK: Connecticut has won **23** consecutive regular season games entering Tuesday's game vs. DePaul.

Over the 23-game skein, the Huskies have average a 32.2 margin of victory (740 total point differential).

UCONN ALL-TIME VS. DEPAUL: UConn and DePaul will be meeting for the **seventh** time overall in the sport of women's basketball when they square off Tuesday at Gampel Pavilion.

The Huskies lead the all-time series with the Blue Demons 5-1 and have won the last five meetings in the series by an average of 10.2 points.

UConn's has not lost to to the Blue Demons since the first meeting between the programs on Dec. 28, 1983 - when it dropped a 70-64 decision in Miami, Fla.

UConn is a perfect 3-0 against DePaul in games played in Connecticut.

MONTGOMERY JOINS ELITE CLUB:

With her six assists against LSU on Jan. 3, UConn senior **Renee Montgomery** became just the third player in the history of the UConn women's basketball program to notch **1,500 points** and **500 assists** in her career.

She joins former National Players of the Year, **Jennifer Rizzotti** and **Diana Taurasi** as the only UConn players to reach those numbers.

Montgomery also joined Svetlana Abrosimova and Shea Ralph as the only UConn players to rank among the program's top-10 career leaders in scoring, assists and steals when she cracked the top-10 scoring list Jan. 10 at West Virginia.

BIG EAST DOMINANCE: Connecticut has won 117 of its last 125 games against BIG EAST opponents in the regular season, entering Tuesday's game vs. DePaul.

DEFENDING THEIR TURF: The Huskies boast a record of 270-11 (.961) at home (Storrs & Hartford) since the 1993-94 season.

UCONN AS NO. 1: UConn enters Tuesday's game vs. DePaul 208-11 (.950) all-time when playing as the nation's No. 1 ranked team in the Associated Press Top 25.

The Huskies most recent loss when ranked No. 1 came on April 6, 2008 vs. Stanford.

116 WEEKS ALL-TIME AT NO. 1: UConn earned the No. 1 ranking for a record 116th time on Jan. 12 - extending its lead over Tennessee (112) for the most weeks at the top spot by any NCAA Division I program.

UConn's longest run as the nation's top ranked squad spanned 30 weeks (Nov. 9, 1999-Jan. 15, 2001), while its shortest stretch at the top spot was a one-week stay (Feb. 24-March 1, 2004).

The Huskies have been ranked No. 1 in each of the first 10 Associated Press polls this season.

THE MARGIN OF VICTORY: UConn enters Tuesday's game vs. DePaul having won its first 15 games of the season by an average of 34.9 points - which ranks as the largest average margin of victory among NCAA national leaders

The Huskies have posted seven wins by margins of greater than 40 points over its first 15 games this season.

ROAD SAVVY: The Huskies are 80-9 on the road since Feb. 1, 2001.

The Huskies have not lost back-to-back road games since the 1992-93 season when it lost at Miami (2/14) and Pittsburgh (2/24).

101 STRAIGHT VS. NON-RANKED: Connecticut has won 101 consecutive games against non-ranked opponents.

UConn last loss to an unranked foe on Dec. 21, 2004 at Arizona State (61-50).

HUSKIES AT 16-0: Connecticut will be seeking to open a season 16-0 for the second straight time and the seventh time since 1994-95.

The Huskies opened a perfect 21-0 in 2007-08 before falling 73-71 at Rutgers in Game #22.

ON CPTV: UConn's will play a minimum of 16 games that will be televised on Connecticut Public Television (CPTV) in 2008-09.

The Huskies are 12-0 on the network in 2008-09 following its Jan. 10 win at West Virginia.

During the last 14 seasons, CPTV has aired a total of 321 UConn games with the Huskies boasting a 313-8 (.975) mark in those contests.

HUSKIES VS. THE UNRANKED: UConn is 236-3 in its last 239 games (dating back to Jan. 31, 1999) overall against opponents not ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 - and has won 101 straight such games.

The Huskies' lone losses came at Notre Dame (Jan. 13, 2004), Villanova (Feb. 28, 2004) and at Arizona State (Dec. 21, 2004).

The Huskies are a tough out against non-ranked opponents at home - having won their last 219 games against unranked opponents on their home court(s).

UConn's last home loss to an unranked foe came on Feb. 27, 1993 vs. Georgetown.

ALL-TIME VS. RANKED FOES: Connecticut has an all-time record of 131-53 (.712) versus Top-25 AP ranked teams.

UConn is 30-20 all-time on the road against ranked opponents and 8-6 in road games against ranked teams since 2004-05.

UConn is 59-36 (.621) all-time vs. opponents ranked in the AP Top-10.

The Huskies are 1-0 against ranked opponents in 2008-09.

HUSKIES AVOID BACK-TO-BACK OVER AND OVER: The Huskies have not lost back-to-back games since the 1992-93 season entering Tuesday's game vs. DePaul.

The last time UConn dropped consecutive games was during the 1992-93 season when they lost against Providence (3/7/93) and Louisville (3/17/93).

Connecticut has gone **553** games without back-to-back defeats.

The Huskies are 45-0 following a loss during the streak following its Nov. 16 win over Georgia Tech.

THE LAST 100: Over their last 100 games, the Huskies have posted a mark of **92-8**.*

* - first game of last 100 was a 79-64 win at Notre Dame on Feb. 19, 2006.

HUSKY STREAKS: UConn is **139-2** in its last **141 BIG EAST home games**...The Huskies have won **30 of their last 33** NCAA Tournament games... the Huskies have won **87 of the last 89 regular-season games in Gampel Pavilion**... Connecticut has won **117 of its last 125 games** against BIG EAST opponents in the regular season... UConn has won each of its last **219 games** vs. unranked teams at home during the regular season...the Huskies are **80-9** in their last **89** road games.

SINCE 1999-2000: UConn is **315-28 (.918)** overall since the 1999-00 season. During that span the Huskies have won four national championships.

SINCE 1994-95: Connecticut is **480-41 (.921)** overall since the 1994-95 season. During that span the Huskies have won five national championships.

MOORE EYEING 1,000: UConn sophomore **Maya Moore** enters Tuesday's game vs. DePaul with **953 points** in **53 career games** - well within reach of becoming the fastest player in UConn history to reach the 1,000-point milestone.

The UConn record for the least games needed to reach 1,000 points is 63 by Svetlana Abrosimova.

Moore, at her current average of 18.5 points per game, would reach the milestone on Jan. 19 at North Carolina - her 56th career game.

BIG EAST DOMINANCE: The Huskies boast an overall record of **333-84 (.798)** in regular season BIG EAST play - and have won either the BIG EAST Regular Season or Tournament title in each of the past **15** seasons - including the **2007-08 BIG EAST Regular Season and Tournament Titles - overall the Huskies have garnered a total of 30 BIG EAST Championships (16 regular season, 14 tournament).**

During UConn's amazing run of 11 consecutive BIG EAST regular season titles (1994-2004), the Huskies owned a sterling record of **181-7 (.963)**.

The Huskies notched their **sixth undefeated season in BIG EAST games in 2006-07 - the most of any other team in the league.**

UConn also holds the record for most consecutive winning seasons in league play - **with its current streak of 22 consecutive seasons.**

Since 1986-87, the Huskies have been over .500 for the past 22-straight seasons. The next closest is Notre Dame, which posted 10 winning seasons in a row from 1995-2005.

HUSKIES SLOTTED AS FAVORITES IN BIG EAST PRESEASON POLL. MOORE NAMED PRE-SEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR: The University of Connecticut women's basketball team, which swept the 2007-08 BIG EAST regular season and tournament titles, has been selected as the favorites to win the 2008-09 BIG EAST women's basketball regular season title by a tally of the league's 16 head coaches, which was announced at the league's annual media day at ESPN Zone in New York City's Time Square.

In the 27 years of BIG EAST women's basketball, Connecticut has been crowned the regular-season champion 16 times, has won 14 league tournament titles and has captured both titles in the same year in 12 seasons.

Connecticut earned 14 first-place votes for a total of 224 points in the poll. The Huskies went 15-1 in league play a year ago, finished the season with a 36-2 overall record, earned a berth to the NCAA Championship for the 20th straight year and advanced to their ninth Final Four. UConn returns four of its five starters from last year's Final Four team, and lost just four letterwinners from that squad.

UConn sophomore Maya Moore, was chosen as the 2008-09 BIG EAST Preseason Player of the Year, Moore became the first player – men's or women's – in conference history to be named BIG EAST Freshman and Player of the Year in the same season.

Moore had an exceptional rookie season as she was named BIG EAST Freshman of the Week a league-record 10 times and was named BIG EAST Player of the Week on March 3 becoming the first freshman – male or female – to win both awards in the same week.

UConn will also be led by 2008-09 Preseason All-BIG EAST Team members Renee Montgomery and Tina Charles.

Montgomery, a senior, will return to her natural position of point guard this season. She enters the season having started 99 consecutive games and has registered points in 97 straight games overall.

Charles, a junior center, averaged 14.2 points per game and a team-high 9.2 rebounds per game. She enters the season just four points shy of cracking 1,000 for her career and already ranks in a tie for the sixth best shot blocking totals in the program's history.

Both were named to the Associated Press All-America Third Team squad in 2007-08, while Montgomery was a 2008 WBCA All-America First Team selection and Charles was an honorable mention pick.

DOUBLE-FIGURE POINTS FOR PARTY OF FIVE: UConn has had at least five players register double-figure points six times over the first 15 games this season.

UConn had five players score in double-figures seven times in 38 games last year.

CHARLES SITS IN FOURTH ON CAREER SWAT LIST: UConn's Tina Charles is wasting no time in making her assault on the UConn career block list, in this just her junior season.

Charles currently is fourth among UConn career block leaders at 172 - she enters Tuesday's game vs. DePaul just 10 behind Kelly Schumacher (181) for fourth place.

HUSKIES + BIG EAST = 30 TITLES: Connecticut has amassed an astounding 30 BIG EAST titles in the program's history following its sweep of both the league regular season and tournament titles in 2008 - marking the first time since 2002 and the 12th time in the program's history that the Huskies have pulled off the double.

The Huskies followed a 15-1 regular season conference mark (16th title) by winning three straight over DePaul, Pittsburgh and Louisville by an average of 17.3 ppg to claim their 14th BIG EAST Tournament championship.

VS. THE BIG EAST (EXCEPT RUTGERS): The Huskies last loss to a BIG EAST opponent in the regular season not named Rutgers came on Feb. 26, 2005 at Boston College, which is now a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The Huskies last conference loss to a current league member other than Rutgers dates back to a Jan. 30, 2005 loss to Notre Dame (65-59).

Connecticut has won 51 straight BIG EAST regular season games against opponents other than Rutgers.

VS. NON-CONFERENCE AT HOME: Connecticut has won 15 consecutive regular season home games against non-conference opponents following its win over LSU on Jan. 3.

HUSKIES AT THE XL CENTER: UConn owns an all-time mark of 91-11 (.892) in games played at the XL Center.

The Huskies have won each of their last 15 games played at the XL Center in Hartford, dating back to a 55-47 loss vs. Rutgers on March 6, 2007 - in the championship game of the 2007 BIG EAST Tournament.

UConn ON CBS: Since the 1995-96 season, the Huskies have made 14 appearances on CBS - posting an 8-6 mark in those games during the regular season, following its 76-63 win over LSU on Jan. 3, 2009.

UConn had dropped its last four games on the network, dating back to a 68-67 loss vs. Duke at the Hartford Civic Center on Jan. 3, 2004, prior to its 100-50 win at Purdue on Jan. 6, 2008.

Prior to that recent losing skid, UConn had won each of its previous four games which were televised nationally on CBS.

HUSKIES ON NATIONAL TV: UConn is scheduled to play nine nationally-televised games in 2008-09.

The Jan. 3 game vs. LSU on CBS marked its third this season.

UConn is 68-18 in nationally televised contests since 2001-02, including a 3-0 mark in 2008-09, following previous wins this season over Oklahoma, Penn State and LSU.

HUSKIES IN DECEMBER: The Huskies have also enjoyed tremendous success in the month of December as they boast an all-time mark of 161-54 (.749) following a perfect mark of 7-0 in the final month in 2008.

The Huskies have won 86 of their last 89 games played in the final month of the calendar year dating back to December 30, 1993.

UConn has won 23 consecutive games in the month of December.

The Huskies had won 60 consecutive games during the month of December prior to a 61-50 loss at Arizona State on 12/21/04.

PERFECT IN NON-CONFERENCE: Following the Jan. 3 win over LSU, Connecticut boasts a 28-game regular season winning streak against non-conference opponents, including a perfect 13-0 this season.

UConn was a perfect 14-0 in non-conference games last year including wins over LSU, Stanford, Duke and North Carolina.

The streak dates back to a 82-76 loss at North Carolina on Jan. 15, 2007.

UConn in BIG EAST OPENERS: Following its Jan. 6 win at South Florida, UConn is 22-5 all-time in conference openers and have won their last 17 straight.

UConn's last loss in a BIG EAST opener came against Georgetown on Jan. 3, 1992 by the score of 65-60.

This marked the fifth consecutive year that UConn has opened BIG EAST play on the road.

HUSKIES OWN REGULAR SEASON TOURNEY PLAY: Connecticut captured the 2008 Caribbean Classic championship in Cancun Dec. 18-21 - extending its streak of titles at in-season tournaments to 12 straight.

The Huskies defeated Stanford, Old Dominion and Duke en route to the 2007 Paradise Jam title in St. Thomas, USVI, last season and claimed the 2005 Preseason WNIT Title with wins over Marist, Indiana State, Boston College and Oklahoma.

Prior to that, the Huskies won the 2002 Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, the 2001 Preseason WNIT, Four in the Fall Tournament in 1998 in San Jose, Calif., the 1997 Preseason WNIT, the 1996 Connecticut Classic, the 1995 Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, the 1995 Central Fidelity Invitational in Richmond, Va., the 1995 Connecticut Classic and the 1994 Connecticut Classic.

The last time that UConn failed to claim an in-season tournament title came back during the 1992-93 when it dropped a game to Vanderbilt on Dec. 29, 1992 at the Hilton Head (S.C.) Super Shootout.

UConn has won each of its last 37 games that it has played at in-season tournaments.

An in-season tournament is defined as any event in which Connecticut played more than one game en route to the championship.

MONTGOMERY LIGHTS IT UP VS. FLORIDA STATE: Senior Renee Montgomery drilled seven 3-pointers in UConn's Dec. 21 win vs. Florida State in Cancun.

The seven treys, tied a career-high for Montgomery and also equaled the second-highest single-game 3-point field goal total in UConn history.

Montgomery finished the game with 25 points and eight assists in win over Seminoles - her ninth game this season in double-figure points and her second 20-plus scoring effort.

ASSISTS ALL AROUND VS. FLORIDA STATE: Connecticut shared the ball well in its Dec. 21 win over Florida State as it assisted on an amazing 31-of-35 field goals.

The 31 assists marked the most for the Huskies since posting 32 vs. Dartmouth on march, 20, 2005 in the opening round of the 2005 NCAA Tournament.

MONTGOMERY NAMED AS CANDIDATE FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: The accolades keep rolling in for UConn All-America Renee Montgomery as she has been named as a candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

Montgomery will be looking to become the second UConn player to capture the award, joining Sue Bird, who was recognized in 2002.

Thirty senior male and female NCAA college basketball players were announced today as candidates for the 2008-09 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports. Based on criteria focusing on the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition, the award winners will be selected by national balloting of head basketball coaches, national media and college basketball fans.

Lowe's, an official corporate partner of the NCAA, will present the winners with trophies during the weekends of the respective NCAA Men's and Women's Final Four.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the award was launched during the 2001-02 season to honor the attributes of college basketball seniors who remain committed to their university and pursue the many rewards that a senior season and complete college education brings.

NO TV: The Dec. 18 game against Washington marked the first UConn regular season or postseason game that was not televised since the 1999-00 season - a span of 316 consecutive games.

The last time a UConn game was not televised was on January 29, 2000 at Miami (Fla.) at the Miami Arena.

90 PLUS IN FIVE STRAIGHT: UConn saw its streak end vs. Penn State on Dec. 14 of having posted 91 points or more for five consecutive games.

The Huskies last scored 90 or more points in five straight games was when they scored 100 in five straight games to open the 1998-99 season against Duke, Arkansas, UCLA, Washington and Holy Cross.

DOTY CAN'T MISS 3-BALL STREAK: UConn freshman **Caroline Doty** connected on a program record **10 consecutive 3-point field goals** before seeing the dead-eye streak end against Penn State on Dec. 14.

Doty made her last three at BYU (Nov. 25) before following with a 6-of-6 effort vs. Oklahoma (Nov. 30) and a perfect 3-of-3 vs. Holy Cross (Dec. 3).

The NCAA record for consecutive 3-point field goals is 14-of-14 by Portland's Deana Lansing in 1996 and matched by Mount Saint Mary's Lauren Howell in 2008.

GAMPEL DOMINANCE: UConn is **87-2** in its last **89** games at Gampel Pavilion.

DOING 100: UConn's **106** points in its Nov. 30 win over Oklahoma marked the **56th** time in program history that the Huskies have notched at least 100 points and the first time since January 6, 2008 against Purdue (100-50).

THREE PLAYERS SEEING DOUBLE: UConn's Nov. 30 win over Oklahoma marked the first time UConn has had **three players with double-doubles (Maya Moore, Renee Montgomery, Tina Charles)** since February 6, 2007 against Rutgers. (Charde Houston 16 pts/11 rebs, Tina Charles 15 pts/10 rebs, and Kalana Greene 15 pts/10 rebs).

MONTGOMERY HAS CAREER NIGHT VS. SOONERS: UConn senior **Renee Montgomery** had a career night in UConn's 106-78 win over No. 4/4 Oklahoma on Nov. 30.

Montgomery registered her first career double-double with a career-high 30 points and 13 assists while shooting 11-of-22 overall from the field.

The 14 assists tied a UConn single-game record she now shares with Laura Lishness (January 12, 1991) and Susie Sturman (February 24, 1980).

FRESHMAN DOTY PERFECT UNDER THE BRIGHT LIGHTS: **Caroline Doty** didn't waste any time displaying her talents in her first appearance before a national television audience as the freshman opened the Nov. 20 game vs. No. 4/4 Oklahoma a perfect 4-of-4 on 3-point field goal attempts in the first half.

Doty closed out the game a perfect 6-of-6 from beyond the arc, becoming the first player in UConn history to be a perfect 6-of-6 in a game - setting a new single-game mark for consecutive three's made.

MONTGOMERY EARNS FIRST BIG EAST POW HONOR: UConn senior **Renee Montgomery** was named BIG EAST Player of the Week for the first time in her career following her exploits against BYU and Oklahoma for the period ending Nov. 30.

Montgomery averaged team-best **24.5** points per game, while shooting **59.4 percent (19-of-32)** from the field in Connecticut's two wins at Brigham Young (97-46) on Nov. 25 and at home against No. 4/4 Oklahoma (106-78) on Nov. 30.

The senior guard also averaged 7.5 assists per game and shot 64.3 percent (9-of-14) from 3-point range. Montgomery put together a career night against Oklahoma. She registered career-highs with 30 points and 13 assists. The assist total tied the single-game record in

TRIO OF HUSKIES NAMED TO NAISMITH NATIONAL POW WATCH LIST:

UConn players Maya Moore, Renee Montgomery and Tina Charles have each been named to the 50-player early season "Watch List" for the 2008-09 Naismith Trophy, which recognizes the national player of the year.

Connecticut has had three different players claim the award in its history with Rebecca Lobo (1995), Sue Bird (2002) and Diana Taurasi (2002, 2003) earning previous honors.

The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2008-09 college basketball season.

The watch list does not include incoming freshmen, although those student-athletes will be considered in the first vote in February, 2009. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2009 NCAA Women's Final Four in St. Louis, Mo.

In February, the Naismith Trophy voting academy, comprised of leading basketball journalists, coaches and administrators from around the country, will narrow its preseason list to the Top 30 players in the nation. Those players, and others who distinguish themselves throughout the season, will be eligible for the final ballot in March.

LARGEST WIN VS. TOP-5 FOE SINCE...: UConn's 28-point win on Nov. 30 vs. then No. 4/4 Oklahoma was the largest margin of victory against a AP ranked Top-5 team since it defeated No. 3 Georgia 99-70 on November 12, 2000, a 29-point margin.

HUSKIES IN ROAD OPENERS: Following its No. 25 win at BYU, UConn boasts a 26-9 record in its first game away from home of the season.

The Huskies have won 12 of their last 13 initial road (or neutral) games of the season following its Nov. 25 win at BYU with the lone loss coming on Nov. 21, 2004 against North Carolina in Raleigh.

HIGHEST RANKED OPPONENT AT GAMPSEL SINCE...: No. 4/4 Oklahoma marked the highest-ranked opponent the Huskies have faced at Gampel Pavilion since defeating No. 3/3 North Carolina 82-71 on Jan. 21, 2008.

UConn is 3-2 in its last four games at Gampel Pavilion against opponents ranked in the top-10 nationally.

The Huskies previously defeated No. 3/3 North Carolina in 2007-08, No. 9/9 Purdue in 2006-07 and lost to No. 9/9 Rutgers in 2005-06 and No. 6/7 Notre Dame in 2004-05.

HUSKIES IN NOVEMBER: Following its Nov. 20 win over Oklahoma, UConn boasts an all-time mark of 85-14 (.859) in games played in the month of November.

The last time UConn dropped a game in the month of November came on Nov. 21, 2004 at the Jimmy V Classic, when the Huskies fell 71-65 to North Carolina.

UConn has won 20 consecutive games in the month of November.

COMPLETE BALANCE: UConn opened the season with at least five Connecticut players registering double-figure points over the first four games.

A total of eight UConn players registered double-figure scoring efforts a total of 21 times over the first four games this season.

The four-game streak to open the season is the first of its type in the program's history.

100TH GAME IN HARTFORD: The Nov. 22 game vs. Rhode Island marked the 100th UConn women's basketball game played at the XL Center (formerly Hartford Civic Center).

The Huskies posted a 89-11 record in the facility over their first 100 games.

TRI-CAPTAINS NAMED: UConn senior Renee Montgomery, junior Kalana Greene and sophomore Maya Moore have been named as the team's tri-captains entering the 2008-09 season.

Montgomery will be serving as a captain for the third consecutive season - the first time a player has had that distinction since Geno Auriemma became head coach in 1985-86.

Sandy Gavin (1982-84) is the only other player in UConn history to serve as a team captain for three consecutive seasons.



CHARLES THIRD FASTEST HUSKY TO 1,000: UConn junior center Tina Charles scored her 1,000th career point in the Nov. 16 season opener against Georgia Tech.

Not only did she become the 31st player in UConn history to do so, she became the third fastest player in UConn history to reach the milestone (75 games), behind only Svetlana Abrosimova (63 games) and Nyskesha Sales (74 games).

Charles was honored prior to the Huskies game on Saturday, Nov. 22 vs. Rhode Island for reaching the milestone.

Charles joins UConn teammate Renee Montgomery as players on the roster with 1,000 career points.

Montgomery and then-senior Mel Thomas eclipsed the 1,000-point milestone in 2007-08.

COUNTDOWN TO 800: Tuesday's game vs. DePaul will mark the 795th in the career of UConn head coach Geno Auriemma.

Auriemma will coach his 800th career game when the Huskies trek to Washington, D.C., to battle Georgetown on Jan. 31.

CONFERENCE CONTROL: UConn is 117-8 in its last 125 games vs. BIG EAST opponents in the regular season (since Jan. 18, 2001).

BIG EAST HOME COURT STREAK: UConn has won its last 17 BIG EAST Conference home games - dating back to a Feb. 7, 2006 loss vs. Rutgers (60-56).

UCONN WOMEN ON BIG MONDAY: Connecticut has made seven overall appearances on ESPN's "Big Monday" package entering the 2008-09 season.

ESPN began to include women's games in its "Big Monday" package in 2005-06.

Connecticut is 5-2 overall in its previous "Big Monday" appearances and posted a 3-0 in 2007-08.

UCONN IN SEASON OPENERS: The Huskies are 27-8 all-time in regular season openers following its Nov. 16 win over Georgia Tech and own a 20-4 mark in such games since Geno Auriemma took over the program's reigns in 1985-86.

UConn is a solid 17-2 in season openers dating back to 1990-91 and owns a 13- game winning streak in season openers entering Sunday's contest.

The Huskies last loss in an opener came on Nov. 19, 1995 - an 83-81 setback vs. Louisiana Tech.

UCONN IN HOME OPENERS: The Huskies always are comfortable in their home base - especially in their first appearance in front of the home folks, as they have compiled an impressive 30-5 all-time mark in home openers following its Nov. 16 win over Georgia Tech.

UConn is 23-1 in home openers under head coach Geno Auriemma.

The Huskies only loss under Auriemma in a home opener came

on Nov. 29, 1990 - a 17-point loss vs. Iowa (58-41).

Connecticut has won its last 18 home openers with its win over Georgia Tech.

HOT SHOOTING CONTINUES: The Huskies shot .600 or better in its wins over San Diego State (11/20), Rhode Island (11/22) and at BYU (11/25).

It marked the first time that Connecticut has posted a .600 field goal percentage or better in consecutive games since the 2005-06 season when it pulled off the trick against Seton Hall (1/10/06) and Cincinnati (1/12/06).

It also marked the first time since the 1994-95 season that UConn shot .600 or better in three straight games.

HONORING PERFECTION: The 1994-1995 University of Connecticut women's basketball team, which won the 1995 NCAA National Championship and posted a perfect 35-0 overall record, was inducted into the "UConn Huskies of Honor" recognition program at halftime of the Nov. 16 game vs. Georgia Tech.

The "Huskies of Honor" program, which pays visible tribute in the Harry A. Gampel Pavilion to the top individual and team achievements in UConn men's and women's basketball history, was launched in 2006.

The honoring of UConn's unbeaten 1995 National Championship team represented the first induction of an entire team (players and coaches) into Connecticut's "Huskies of Honor" program.

CLOSE SHAVE IN OPENER: The Huskies 2008-09 season-opener vs. Georgia Tech saw the Huskies tied with the Yellow Jackets at the half 34-34.

It marked the first time that the Huskies have been trailing or tied in a season-opener against a non-ranked opponent since Nov. 24, 1991, when it trailed at California at intermission 37-31 - the Huskies went on to lose that contest 76-60.

PRESEASON HISTORY: Following its exhibition game win vs. Team SRP on Nov. 12, UConn boasts a 21-2 mark in preseason games, dating back to 1997.

The Huskies only two exhibition losses in that span, include a 90-74 loss vs. the U.S. National Team in 2007 and a 79-73 decision to the Houston Jaguars on Nov. 13, 2002 at Gampel Pavilion.

Connecticut has won 11 of its last 12 exhibition games.

DOING 100 IN PRESEASON: UConn posted a pair of decisive victories in its two preseason tune ups in 2008-09. First the Huskies handed Stonehill College a 100-49 setback before pounding Team SRP 103-37 on Nov. 12.

It marked the first time that Connecticut has posted at least 100 points in both of its exhibition contests since the 2006-07 campaign.

MAYA MOORE NAMED TO PRESEASON AP ALL-AMERICA: Sophomore Maya Moore has been named to the Associated Press preseason All-America team, which was released Nov. 4.

Moore joined Oklahoma's Courtney Paris, Louisville's Angel McCoughtry, Maryland's Kristi Tolliver and Oklahoma State's Andrea Riley on the five-player squad.

Last season saw Moore become only the second freshman in NCAA Division I women's basketball history to be recognized with first team Associated Press All-America honors, joining Paris.

Moore will be attempting to become the fourth player in UConn history to be a two-time Associated Press first team All-America, joining Diana Taurasi, Kara Wolters and Nykesha



Sales.

Moore was only one vote shy of being a unanimous selection as she appeared on 44 of the 45 possible ballots.

Last season, Moore led the Huskies in scoring at 17.8 ppg and became the first freshman in BIG EAST Conference history (male or female) to be recognized as the conference's player of the year.

HUSKIES OPENS SEASON NO. 1 IN BOTH AP AND COACHES POLLS:

The University of Connecticut women's basketball team was ranked No. 1 nationally in the 2008 Associated Press Preseason Top-25, which was released Nov. 1 and the ESPN/USA Today Top 25, which was announced Nov. 5.

This marks the first time since 2004 and the sixth time in the program's history that Connecticut has been ranked No. 1 by the Associated Press in the preseason.

The Huskies received 44 of 45 first-place votes and garnered a total of 1,124 from a national media panel in the Associated Press poll, while they received 30 of 31 first-place votes in the coaches poll.

UConn has captured the NCAA National Championship in three of the previous five seasons it opened as the nation's No. 1 team (1999-00, 2001-02, 2003-04). It also opened the year ranked No. 1 to start the 1995-96 and 2000-01 seasons.

HUSKIES ON THE DEUCE: Connecticut will play a minimum of four regular games on ESPN2 this season.

The Huskies own an 35-10 record on the "Deuce" since 2001-02 and posted a perfect 7-0 mark on the network in 2007-08.

BACK AT NO. 1: The UConn women's basketball team once again is in the No. 1 spot in the Associated Press Poll, which was released on Monday, Dec. 29, for the ninth straight week.

The Huskies returned to the top spot after being ranked No. 1 nationally for a total of 12 weeks during the 2007-08 season.

The latest No. 1 ranking marks the 10th time in which the Huskies have earned the top ranking nationally in the program's history. Connecticut has now been ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll for a total of 115 weeks in the program's history - the most all-time in NCAA Division I history.

TRIO OF HUSKIES NAMED AMONG WOODEN CANDIDATES:

The University of Connecticut women's basketball is the only team in the nation to have three players named among the 2008-09 pre-season candidates for the Women's Wooden Award All-America Team and Player of the Year, which were announced Nov. 5.

Representing the Huskies on the 30-player list are senior Renee Montgomery, junior Tina Charles and sophomore Maya Moore.

Joining Connecticut with multiple players selected were Maryland (Toliver and Marissa Coleman), California (Devane'i Hampton, Ashley Walker) and Rutgers (Prince, Kia Vaughn), each of which had two players named to the list.

UConn has had a total of two players named to the Wooden All-America Team as Moore was named to the five-member squad in 2008 and Diana Taurasi in 2004, which was the inaugural season in which a team was chosen for women's basketball.

In mid-January, the Wooden Award Committee will release the Midseason Top 20 list, followed in March by the National Ballot, con-

sisting of approximately 15 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Women's Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament.

The 33rd annual Wooden Award ceremony, which will include the announcement of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award, and the presentation of the Wooden Award All-American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award to Rick Barnes from The University of Texas, will be held at The Los Angeles Athletic Club in April, 2009.

BIG EAST EXTENDS TOURNAMENT AGREEMENT WITH HARTFORD:

The 2009 BIG EAST Women's Basketball Championship will return to the XL Center in Hartford, Conn. for the sixth straight year. For the first time all 16 BIG EAST schools will participate.

The 2009 championship will be held March 6-10 with five full days of action and 15 games. The BIG EAST's teams will battle for the conference tournament title and one will earn the league's automatic bid to the 64-team NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship.

It was also announced at 2008 BIG EAST Media Day that the conference has extended their relationship with the XL Center hosting the BIG EAST Women's Basketball Tournament through the 2011 event.

"We are extremely pleased to have the BIG EAST Women's Basketball Championship remain in Hartford for another two years," said Tranghese. "We believe we have one of the premier women's basketball championships in the nation in terms of competitiveness and attendance. Further, we are excited to continue to showcase our nationally recognized programs in a public arena that resides in the heart of a city that supports collegiate women's basketball with such enthusiasm."



ANOTHER 30-WIN CAMPAIGN: With its 86-67 win over DePaul in the 2008 BIG EAST quarterfinals, Connecticut clinched its third consecutive 30-win season and the 13th in the program's history - all since 1993-94.

UConn has won 30-plus games in 13 of the past 15 seasons overall with the only exceptions coming in 1998-99 and 2004-05.

NCAA'S TO RETURN TO STORRS IN 2009: The NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee has selected 17 additional first- and second-round sites for the 2009 and 2010 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship and those sites have been approved by the NCAA Division I Championships/Competition Cabinet.

The University of Connecticut will host first and second round NCAA Tournament games in 2009 at Gampel Pavilion in Storrs. The selection will mark the first time UConn has hosted NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament games at Gampel Pavilion since the 2005 season.

The sites were added after the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee announced in the summer of 2007 that the championship would be expanding to 16 pre-determined first- and second-round sites beginning in 2009.

Additional cities chosen to host first- and second-round games in 2009 include Bowling Green, Kentucky; Chattanooga, Tennessee; East Lansing, Michigan; Iowa City, Iowa; Notre Dame, Indiana; San Diego, California; Seattle, Washington and Storrs, Connecticut.

The additional first and second rounds of the 2010 championship will be played in Albuquerque, New Mexico; Ames, Iowa; Cincinnati, Ohio; Durham, North Carolina; Louisville, Kentucky; Norman, Oklahoma; Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; Tallahassee, Florida and Seattle.

"The committee was pleased with the amount of interest generated when we announced that we were going to 16 pre-determined sites again in 2009 and 2010," said Judy Southard, senior associate director of athletics at Louisiana State University and chair of the Division I Women's Basketball Committee. "To be able to get a good blend of cities that have past hosting experience in combination with a number of new cities and venues is good for the continued growth of the game of women's basketball and our championship."

750 WINS: Connecticut's 82-71 win in the season opener against Georgia Tech on Nov. 16 marked the 750th win in the history of the UConn women's basketball program.

The Huskies have averaged nearly 23 wins a season over their 34-year history of women's basketball.

POLE POSITION: The University of Connecticut women's basketball team has been a regular in the Associated Press & ESPN Coaches Top 25 for 294 consecutive weeks.

The Huskies are currently ranked No. 1, the 8th overall week this season they have been slotted at No. 1 (released Jan. 5).

HUSKIES EARN 229th TOP-5 AP POLL APPEARANCE: Connecticut's current No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25, which was released Jan. 12, marked the 229th time that the Huskies have garnered a top-5 ranking in the program's history.

UConn has made 229 appearances (as of Jan. 12) in the AP Top-5 which ranks third-most all-time, behind only Tennessee (414) and Louisiana Tech (279).

BIG EAST WELCOMES ALL 16 TEAMS TO TOURNAMENT BEGINNING IN 2008-09: The Presidents of the BIG EAST Conference voted to include all 16 member institutions in the men's and women's basketball tournaments beginning in 2009.

The Presidents took this action at their annual meeting, which was held on Nov. 6 in Philadelphia, Pa.

Currently, the top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings advance to participate in the men's and women's championships. The men's championship is held in New York City at Madison Square Garden. The women's championship is held in Hartford, Conn., at the XL Center.

The new format will have the teams seeded 9 through 16 meet on the first day of competition. The matchups will be No. 9 vs. No. 16, No. 10 vs. No. 15, No. 11 vs. No. 14 and No. 12 vs. No. 13.

The winners of those four games will meet seeds 5 through 8 on the second day of play. The 9/16 winner will advance to play the No. 8 seed. The 10/15 winner will play the No. 7 seed. The 11/14 winner will meet the No. 6 seed. The 12/13 winner will play the No. 5 seed.

Those four winners will advance to play the top four seeds in the quarterfinal round. Thus, the top four seeded teams still will not play until the quarterfinals, which occurs in the current 12-team format.

SELLOUTS IN HARTFORD: Since 2000, UConn has played in front of **37** sellout crowds at the XL Center.

HEAD COACH GENO AURIEMMA: UConn boss **Geno Auriemma** is in his **24th** season at the helm of the Husky program.

During his decorated tenure at Connecticut, Auriemma has guided the Huskies to five national championships, nine Final Fours and 30 BIG EAST titles.

Auriemma boasts a career mark of 672-122 (.846) - his career winning percentage of .846 is the best all-time among active NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Coaches.

He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year for the **seventh** time in 2007-08, was recognized as the 2008 WBCA, Associated Press, USBWA and Naismith National Coach of the Year in 2008.

Overall in his career, Auriemma has received a total of **18 national coach of the year honors.**



**UCONN AND CONNECTICUT PUBLIC TELEVISION
SIGN FOUR-YEAR EXTENSION**

STORRS, Conn. (March 1, 2008) – The University of Connecticut Division of Athletics and Connecticut Public Television (CPTV) have signed a new four-year contract extension for CPTV to continue to be UConn’s exclusive local market television broadcast partner for women’s basketball.

Under the agreement, all local television rights for UConn women’s basketball which are controlled by the University are assigned to CPTV. All other UConn games are controlled by the BIG EAST Conference and subject to Conference television contracts.

The agreement runs from the 2008-09 academic year through 2011-12 and calls for CPTV to televise a minimum of 68 UConn women’s basketball games over the four-year contract period.

"The UConn Division of Athletics and Connecticut Public Television have the most unique partnership in college sports television today," says UConn Director of Athletics Jeffrey Hathaway, pictured above with Jerry Franklin of CPTV. "We are very pleased to announce that our partnership with CPTV to provide local market television coverage of Husky women’s basketball games will continue through the 2011-12 season. UConn receives more media attention on both the national and local level than any other women’s basketball team in the country and this agreement with CPTV will ensure that will continue for years to come."

This latest agreement will generate a minimum of \$3,600,000 in cash to the University. CPTV will guarantee UConn seasonal rights of \$1,000,000 for the 2008-09 women’s basketball local market television rights and that fee for the following years will be -- \$1,000,000 in 2009-2010, \$800,000 in 2010-11 and \$800,000 in 2011-12.

The \$900,000 average annual rights fee is a 12% increase from the previous contract which averaged \$802,000 per year.

Among the new elements of the agreement is the ability for the University to share in corporate underwriting revenue and to sell a signature sponsorship associated with women’s basketball broadcasts on CPTV.

"Connecticut Public Television has set the standard for the televising of college women’s basketball," says Hathaway. "CPTV began to televise our women’s basketball games in 1994 and has become a very important reason why our women’s basketball program enjoys so much success on an annual basis. We appreciate (CPTV President and CEO) Jerry Franklin’s leadership and the tremendous support and dedication provided by CPTV’s viewers and staff."

In addition to the UConn games on CPTV, the agreement calls for the continuation of The Geno Auriemma Show, which appears on CPTV 12 times during the season.

"We’re incredibly pleased to be able to continue our relationship with the University of Connecticut," says Jerry Franklin, President and CEO of Connecticut Public Television. "Our unique programming partnership with UConn Athletics has had a substantial impact on women’s basketball across the country. With the support of our viewers, we’ve been able to showcase the remarkable talents of the women’s basketball program and expand the reach of the sport to Connecticut residents and beyond.

"What we’ve jointly created - UConn Athletics, CPTV and the people of Connecticut - is a tribute to the loyalty of our basketball fans. It’s fitting that this women’s basketball team, through our landmark partnership, has become recognized as one of the most admired and respected teams in the country."

CPTV began its coverage of UConn women’s basketball late in the 1993-94 season, covering the championship game of the 1994 BIG EAST Women’s Basketball Tournament and televising three games in the 1994 NCAA Tournament. During the past 15 seasons, Connecticut Public Television has televised a total of 308 UConn women’s basketball games. In those 308 games, Connecticut has compiled a stunning 300-8 overall record.

During the 2007-08 season, CPTV carried a total of 24 UConn women’s basketball games.

The University and CPTV take great pride in the fact that UConn Women’s Basketball on CPTV continues to be the highest-rated locally produced public television program in the nation.

LAST TIME VS. DEPAUL

HARTFORD, Conn. (March 9, 2008) – Renee Montgomery (St. Albans, W. Va.) scored a game-high 19 points as the No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team downed ninth-seeded DePaul 86-67 on Sunday afternoon in the quarterfinal round of the BIG EAST Championship at the XL Center in Hartford.

With the win, UConn advances to the BIG EAST semifinals for the 20th consecutive year, last missing the league's penultimate stage in 1988. The Huskies upped their mark to 30-1 on the year with the victory while the Blue Demons drop to 20-12. It marks the 13th time in UConn lore that the Huskies have won at least 30 games in a season and the third consecutive year that UConn has reached that milestone.

Montgomery's 19 points were her most in seven career BIG EAST tournament games. Maya Moore (Lawrenceville, Ga.) saw her ninth double-double of the season with 14 points and 15 rebounds. Rebounding, a category where UConn enjoyed a 50-32 edge for the game, played a large role in the first half in particular.

The Huskies opened the game on a somewhat deceptive 10-2 run over the first 6:30. The Blue Demons missed each of their first seven shots and 11 of their first 12 overall against a tight UConn defense but the Huskies were unable to take full advantage as they themselves connected on just five of their first 24 attempts from the floor. DePaul used this extended UConn cold snap to draw within a single point of the Huskies at 12-11 on an Allie Quigley bucket at 10:55 that capped a 7-0 spurt.

Ketia Swanier (Columbus, Ga.) drained UConn's first three- pointer of the contest at 10:19 to get the Huskies back on track but the awakened shooters on each side proceeded to simply trade baskets for the next several minutes. UConn started to put some distance between itself and DePaul as Charde Houston (San Diego, Calif.) scored three straight buckets under the basket to give the Huskies a 27-19 cushion and force a Blue Demon timeout at 6:03. Houston showed a depth of play on the three baskets, scoring the first on a power move, the second on a finesse move and the final one by putting back an errant Husky shot.

UConn's edge reached double digits for the first time at 36-25 on a basket by Tina Charles (Jamaica, N.Y.) at 2:32. Charles and Kaili McLaren (Washington, D.C.) would score each of UConn's final 10 points of the first half as the Huskies took a 44-29 advantage into the locker room at intermission.

UConn's 15-point lead at half time today is a stark contrast from the 12-point deficit it faced midway through a narrow 77-76 win at DePaul just eight days ago. Charles led all scorers with 14 points at the break while Moore had collected nine rebounds to accompany her seven points.

A quick 8-2 spurt to open the second half, keyed by threes from Montgomery and Moore saw the UConn lead balloon past the 20-point plateau at 52-31 at the 17:41 mark and force a Blue Demon timeout. The Huskies continued to hammer away and produced a 19-4 run that spanned most of the middle portion of the second half, eventually opening up a 30-point lead at 78-48 on a fast break-layup by Montgomery with 8:42 left to play. DePaul put up a nice fight down the stretch but the Huskies were able to come away with an 86-67 final to earn a spot in the BIG EAST semifinals for the 20th year in a row.

STORRS, Conn. (November 16, 2008) – Junior Tina Charles scored 15 points to surpass the 1,000-career point mark to lead the No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team over Georgia Tech 82-71 in the Huskies' home opener on Sunday afternoon in Gampel Pavilion.

Charles' 1,000th point came with a layup at the 11:16 mark in the first half as she became the 31st player in UConn history to eclipse the 1,000-point barrier. Her 15 points improved her career point tally to 1,011, placing her at No. 30 on UConn's all-time scorers' list, surpassing Amy Duran's career mark of 1,000. Charles also finished the afternoon with eight rebounds and three blocked shots as her three blocks moved the junior to fifth all-time on UConn's career blocks list with 152, passing Ashja Jones' tally of 151.

With today's victory, UConn improves to 27-8 all-time in regular season openers and has won its last 13 in a row while posting a 20-4 record in regular season openers under head coach Geno Auriemma.

Sophomore Maya Moore recorded her 12th career double-double with 20 points and 14 rebounds as she led the 1-0 Huskies in today's match-up over the 1-1 Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets. Moore also chipped in with six assists while recording 20 points or more for the 14th time in her career. With her 14 rebounds, Moore picked up her 12th double-figure rebound game at UConn.

Caroline Doty, Renee Montgomery and Kalana Greene all finished in double-figures as Montgomery picked up 15 points, four steals and five assists. Doty and Greene added 13 and 11 points, respectively. Montgomery made her 100th consecutive start for the Huskies and the 110th start of her career as she leads all current players in Division I women's basketball in those two categories.

It was a close battle in the first half as the Huskies recorded 20 points in the paint while both teams entered the locker room at the break with the score knotted at 34. The Yellow Jackets, who were facing the Huskies for the first time in program history, finished the first half shooting 12-for-29 from the floor, including a 4-for-5 showing from behind the arc while Mo Bennett led her team with nine points. UConn was led by Montgomery with nine points as well, while Moore had 10 first-half rebounds.

UConn opened the second half by making 4-of-5 shots from the floor along with three free throws to take a 47-38 advantage in the first five minutes of the second frame. Georgia Tech was able to stay in the game as the Yellow Jackets hit 10-of-15 from behind the three-point line, including six three pointers in the second half.

Doty put the Huskies up by nine with a three pointer with under eight minutes to go but a 6-0 run by Georgia Tech cut the UConn lead to three at 65-62. But in the end the Huskies were able to break away as Charles recorded six points in a span of 1:39 to bring the UConn lead to 12 at 78-66.

The Huskies took their largest lead of the night at 15, 81-66, as Moore connected on two free throws with 1:03 left in the game. UConn finished the game with 46 points in the paint and 39 points off Georgia Tech turnovers while the Yellow Jackets connected on 31 bench points. The Huskies shot 29-for-59 from the floor, a 49.2 percentage, that was sparked by a 16-for-26 shooting performance in the second half alone.

At halftime of today's game, the 1994-95 NCAA National Championship team, which finished the season with a perfect 35-0 record, was honored and inducted into the "UConn Huskies of Honor" recognition program in front of a crowd of 8,871.

HARTFORD, Conn. (November 20, 2008) – Sophomore Maya Moore scored 21 points, 17 in the first half, to lead five Huskies in double figures as the No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team cruised to a 99-55 win over San Diego State in non-conference action on Thursday night at the XL Center in Hartford, Conn.

The Huskies improve to 2-0 on the year after tonight's victory as they extended their home-court winning streak in the regular season to 26 consecutive victories while picking up their 89th straight win over non-ranked opponents.

UConn shot 23-for-35 in the first half for 65.7% as San Diego State made just 11 field goals of their 31 attempts. Moore started off the night with five quick points in the Huskies' 12-2 run to open up tonight's contest as she connected for her 38th career game in double figure points, finishing the night with 21 points and nine rebounds, while picking up 17 points and five rebounds in the first half. The sophomore also picked up six assists.

The Huskies' biggest lead of the first half came with 1:15 on the clock as freshman Tiffany Hayes made a nice move to the basket to put UConn up by 29 points to go into the locker room at the break with a 56-27 lead. Junior Tina Charles was 5-for-8 from the floor for 11 points while Moore finished the half making 7-of-12.

UConn used a 14-0 run to begin the second half as Renee Montgomery did not waste any time, knocking down a three pointer just 10 seconds into play. The Huskies outscored San Diego State 43-28 in the second frame, shooting 18-for-29 from the floor, including 4-for-6 from behind the arc. The Aztecs finished the game shooting 23-of-62 for 37.1%, led by Jene Morris with a team-high 17 points.

Hayes finished the game with a career-high 11 points and six rebounds while both Kalana Greene and Montgomery finished with 13 points, respectively. Charles picked up her second consecutive double-figure game of the season with 17 points as she shot 8-for-12 from the field. Greene made her first 10 field goal attempts this season before committing her first miss in tonight's game. Her 13 points marked her second game with double figure points this season and the 32nd of her career.

All 12 players saw action in tonight's contest as 11 Huskies scored with five scoring in double figures. That effort marks the first time the Huskies have had five players post double-digit performances in back-to-back games since March 25 and 30 of the 2007-08 season. The Huskies' largest advantage of tonight's contest came at the 7:29 mark of the second half as Hayes hit a three pointer to put UConn up by 52 at 92-40. UConn's solid offensive performance led the team to 41-of-64 shooting for 64.1% while hitting on 7-of-12 from three point range.

HARTFORD, Conn. (November 22, 2008) – Freshman Tiffany Hayes came off the bench to score a career-high 17 points as the No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team dominated the University of Rhode Island 91-43 on Saturday afternoon in the Huskies' 100th game at the XL Center in Hartford, Conn.

Hayes shot 7-for-9 from the floor and 3-for-5 from behind the arc to lead the Huskies, now 3-0 on the year, to a 33-for-55 and 60.0% showing from the field. Today's game was the first time that UConn has shot 60.0% or higher from the field in back-to-back games since January 10th and 12th, 2006 against Seton Hall and Cincinnati. Rhode Island falls to 1-2 this season with the loss.

Junior Tina Charles led all scorers with 21 points and nine rebounds as she recorded her third straight game with double-figure points this season and the 54th of her career. Five players scored in double-figures as today's game marked the first time that UConn has had five or more players score in double-digits in three consecutive games since Dec. 22, 2000 against Wake Forest, Dec. 30, 2000 against Tennessee and Jan. 2, 2001 against Georgetown.

UConn took a 53-16 lead into the break as the Huskies shot 17-for-30 from the floor for 56.7% and held the Rams to just seven field goals in the first 20 minutes of play. The Huskies' only deficit of the contest came 1:36 into the game as Lindsay Harris' jumper at 18:24 put the Rams up 4-2. UConn wasted no time answering back with a 17-0 run in a span of 4:18 to put the Huskies up 19-4. Charles led the Huskies with seven points during the run then followed with five points in UConn's 24-0 run to pull ahead by 42 at 51-9 with 3:33 left in the half.

Renee Montgomery's 14 points moved her past Sue Bird, Carla Berube and Jamelle Elliot into a tie for 18th place on the UConn scoring list with Leah Curl as her total career points improves to 1,388 points. Sophomore Maya Moore added 13 points, marking her third consecutive game in double-figures this season and 39th of her career.

Freshman Caroline Doty contributed to the Huskies' success with 14 points, three steals and four rebounds as UConn lead by as much as 56 in the second half of play.

UConn shot 9-for-19 from three point range in today's non-conference match-up, while recording 37 points off the Rams' 26 turnovers. The Huskies allowed just 17 field goals from the Rams' offensive efforts as Rhode Island shot 17-for-54 for 31.5% and 8-for-19 from behind the arc for 42.1%. UConn out-rebounded the Rams 38-22 as the Huskies picked up 36 points in the paint against the Rams' eight.

With today's win the Huskies have won the last eight contests against the Rams but still trail URI 13-10 all-time. Today's win was the Huskies' 90th consecutive against non-ranked opponents.

(November 25, 2008) – Renee Montgomery scored 19 points to lead six members of the No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team in double figures in Tuesday night's 96-47 victory at BYU. The Huskies (4-0) held the Cougars (2-2) to just 18 points in the second half en route to their first road victory of the season.

Montgomery shot 4-of-5 from behind-the-arc in the first half to join Maya Moore in double digits before intermission. Moore clinched her second double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 rebounds for her 13th career double-double before halftime.

Moore finished the game with 17 points and 14 boards, shooting 7-of-9 from the field. She was just shy of a triple-double dishing off seven assists in the game.

The Huskies would continue to build upon its lead with a seven-point run midway through the first half. Kalana Greene capped off the run with a three at 8:15. Greene finished the game with 11 points. UConn led 24-11 after the 7-0 run that included baskets from Moore and Montgomery.

Leading by 19 points three times in the final three minutes of the first half, UConn permitted the Cougars to come no closer than 13 points (36-23) at 2:41. Lorin Dixon sunk the basket with less than a minute remaining on the clock for the Huskies greatest lead of the first half (47-26).

Dixon was unable to convert the three-point play, missing the ensuing free throw after BYU's Jazmine Foreman fouled. Dixon was 4-for-5 from the charity stripe in the game and finished with 11 points. Mindy Nielson sank a trey as the first half ended with the Huskies ahead 47-29.

UConn opened the second half with a 16-5 run before scoring 15 unanswered points over a four minute span. Caroline Doty scored five points in the run while Kaili McClaren, Charles and Greene all scored. UConn led 77-36 after a pair of free throws from Dixon at 11:50. Dixon and McClaren finished the game with 11 and 10 points, respectively.

At 8:54, Dixon went to the line again and sank both to put the Huskies ahead, 83-38. UConn controlled the pace of play allowing the Cougars to score one three pointer before stretching its lead to 53 points (96-43) with less than a minute remaining in the game. A pair of BYU free throws and a last second jumper by Keilani Moeaki would give the game its 96-47 final.

(November 30, 2008) - Senior Renee Montgomery recorded a career-high 30 points and a matched a program-best with 13 assists for her first double-double in 116 career games as the No. 1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team defeated No. 4 Oklahoma University 106-78 in front of a crowd of 9,688 in Harry A. Gampel Pavilion on Sunday night.

Montgomery led all scorers as she shot 12-for-22 from the field, while adding six rebounds on the night. Her 30 points moves her past Chris Gedney (1,409) and Peggy Walsh (1,413) into 15th place on the UConn all-time scoring list with a current total of 1,437.

Freshman Caroline Doty added 18 points as she hit 6-for-6 from behind the arc, the first time in program history that player has hit a perfect 6-for-6. She also became the 11th player in UConn history to be perfect from beyond the three point line, with at least four attempts.

With the win, UConn improves to 5-0 on the season while extending its all-time series lead over the Sooners to 7-0. The Huskies have now opened a season 5-0 for the fourth straight time and the 12th in the last 13 seasons overall. Oklahoma drops to 4-2 after tonight's defeat as the Huskies improve to 15-1 all-time against opponents from the Big XII Conference.

Sophomore Maya Moore finished the contest with 27 points and 12 rebounds for her 14th career double-double and her 17th game with 20-plus points. She also added four assists, two blocked shots and two steals. Tina Charles finished with her 56th double-double of her career as she pulled down 10 rebounds while picking up 18 points as four of the five UConn starters scored in double figures.

UConn fell to an early 5-2 deficit, the Sooners only lead of the game, before back-to-back three pointers by Doty and Montgomery flipped the score and put the Huskies up 8-5. The Huskies continued to trade baskets with the Sooners before a 9-0 run put UConn up by 12 as Charles led the way with five straight points, including a three-point play with 9:52 on the clock.

A steal by Charles in front of the UConn bench set up a fast break three pointer by Montgomery to give the Huskies a 14 point advantage as sophomore Lorin Dixon drove the length of the court then dished the ball to Montgomery behind the three point arc with 7:44 to go in the half.

The Huskies had four players in double figures with three minutes left in the first half, led by Moore with 13, as the Huskies shot 19-for-41 from the floor for a 46.3 percentage. Doty shot 4-for-4 from behind the arc as she finished the first frame with 12 points and two rebounds.

Oklahoma's All-American, Courtney Paris, missed her first eight shots of the game as she had eight rebounds and no points in the first half. The Sooners ended the half with an 8-0 run in the last 1:48 to come within 11 as the Huskies took a 50-39 lead into the break. Paris got on the board for the first time when she pulled down an offensive rebound at the 18:55 mark of the second half then proceeded to connect on three consecutive opportunities and finished the contest with 14 points and a team-high 14 rebounds.

The Huskies' defense was able to keep Oklahoma at bay with a 42.5 shooting percentage (17-for-40) from the floor in the second half, including a span of 4:47 in which the Sooners shot just 3-for-12 from the field. STORRS, Conn. (December 3, 2008) - The No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team went on a 32-0 run and held Holy Cross without a field goal for a span of 16:13 en route to a 96-37 win in non-conference action on Wednesday night at Gampel Pavilion.

The Crusaders were scoreless for 10:28, including the last 4:15 of the first half, as the Huskies tacked on the 32-0 burst to extend their lead to 64 points at 78-14. During the 16:13 without a field goal, Holy Cross made just three free throws before UConn's run. The four field goals made by the Crusaders in the first half were the fewest allowed by UConn in a half since December 29, 2007 against Hartford, when they allowed two field goals in the second half.

Tahirah Williams led all scorers with 17 points, while adding seven rebounds, as she finished the night with career highs in points and rebounds. Kailii McLaren (Washington, D.C.) added 10 points, tying her season-high performance at BYU one week ago.

With the win, UConn improves to 6-0 on the season while winning 29 consecutive home games, which is the longest streak in the nation. Holy Cross falls to 1-6 on the year, dropping its second consecutive game after its non-league loss to Western Illinois on Sunday.

Four out of the five starters for the Huskies scored in double figures as Maya Moore (Lawrenceville, Ga.), Tina Charles and Renee Montgomery each had 13 points. Montgomery's three three-point field goals moved her past Maria Conlon (170) for seventh on the Huskies' all-time list with her current career total of 172. Moore's 13 points marked her sixth game this season with double-figure points and the 42nd of her career. She has now scored in double figures in 42 of 44 career games.

Jacque Fernandez' five points and four rebounds were both career highs for the junior as she made her first career three-pointer with 1:51 remaining in the first half. Freshman Tiffany Hayes (Lakeland, Fla.) seven rebounds tied her career high as she pulled down the same number against Rhode Island on Nov. 22.

A 10-0 run to open up tonight's contest sparked a 22-2 UConn lead as the Crusaders were held to just a single basket in the first 5:16 of play. Moore led the Huskies with 11 points in the first 13:10 of the half as she played just seven minutes of the first 20.

Caroline Doty continued her hot hand as she was 3-for-3 from three-point land in the first half as Williams added eight points and five rebounds, shooting a perfect 3-for-3 from the floor. The UConn bench contributed 19 points as every UConn player saw minutes before the break while holding a 63-14 lead heading into the locker room.

The Huskies continued to add to their lead as they began the second half with a 15-0 run before the Crusaders scored their first points of the half on a three-pointer by Whitney Fremeau at the 13:47 mark.

Briana McFadden was the only Holy Cross player to reach double figures as she finished the night with 10 points. She hit two of the Crusaders' four made three pointers of their 27 attempts.

Holy Cross finished the game with 12 turnovers as the Huskies capitalized with 23 points off those mistakes. UConn also out-rebounded the Crusaders 44-28 as they shot 65.5% (38-for-58) from the floor, including a 42.1% (8-for-19) from behind the arc. The Huskies held the Crusaders to 21.3% from the field on 13-61 shooting, including a 12.9% (4-for-31) performance in the first half. Holy Cross also shot just 4-for-27 from the three point mark for 14.8% on the night.

NEW YORK, N.Y. (December 14, 2008) – Junior Tina Charles registered 29 points and 18 rebounds for her second double-double of the season to lead the No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team to a 77-63 victory over Penn State on Sunday afternoon in the second game of the Maggie Dixon Classic at Madison Square Garden.

The Huskies were playing their first game following a 10-day layoff for final semester exams and it took a few minutes for the rust to wear off as the first half featured four ties and five lead changes.

The win moves Connecticut to a perfect 7-0 to open the season for the third consecutive year and the 11th time in the last 13 seasons overall. Penn State falls to 5-5 following the loss and has dropped each of its last six meetings with the Huskies dating back to 1989. Connecticut has now won each of its last 93 games against unranked opponents and extended its non-conference regular season winning streak to 22 games.

Penn State (5-5) led by as many as four points in the first half before Connecticut out-scored the Lady Lions 16-2 over the final 8:24 of the opening frame to claim the lead for good and go into intermission with a 34-21 advantage.

Connecticut increased its lead to 16 points at 58-42 with 10:24 remaining before Penn State made a push to get to within eight points at 69-61 with three minutes remaining.

The Huskies slammed the door on the Lady Lions' upset bid with a run of 8-2 to close out the contest and account for the final 77-63 margin.

The victory improves UConn to 2-0 all-time on the floor at Madison Square Garden and moved the Huskies' record when playing as the nation's No. 1 ranked team in the Associated Press poll to 200-11 all-time.

Joining Charles in double-figures for Connecticut was sophomore Maya Moore with 21 and senior Renee Montgomery who finished with 13 – for her 17th straight double-digit scoring effort.

Tyra Grant led a trio of Penn State players in double-figure points with 26.

The Huskies fell to a quick 4-0 deficit, matching their largest deficit of the season, less than one minute into the game but used a quick 6-0 run to take their first lead of the game, led by four points from sophomore Maya Moore. After a deep three-pointer by South Carolina's Lakeisha Sutton to give the Gamecocks a 7-6 edge, UConn went on an 11-0 run to take an 18-7 advantage as the Huskies paved the way for their 78th regular season road win since February of 2001.

After today's win, UConn improves to a perfect 11-0 on the year, marking the third year and 10th in the last 13 overall seasons that it has opened the season with 11 consecutive victories. South Carolina falls to 6-5 on the year after today's non-conference loss. The Huskies also extended its winning streak vs. non-ranked opponents to 97 straight.

UConn shot 1-of-3 from the field to begin today's contest but used their run early on to take the lead and never look back. Senior Renee Montgomery and Moore hit key three-pointers to help the Huskies take the 18-7 lead and set the tempo of the game.

Freshman Tiffany Hayes scored three of her 11 points on a three-point play with nine minutes to go in the first half before a 2:31 scoring drought by both teams. With 6:29 left in the first frame, Charles made a good move under the basket to put UConn up 27-14. The Huskies went into the break with a 37-19 lead.

Charles led the Huskies at the half with 14 points and 10 rebounds as she finished the game with 21 points, her ninth game in double-figure points this season, while Moore had 12 first half points and three steals. Moore finished the afternoon with her 11th straight game in double-figure points with 15 and her 47th effort in 49 career games. The sophomore added eight assists and five steals.

Montgomery added 13 points to the Huskies' tally, for her 10th game in double-digit scoring this season as Hayes picked up her fourth double-figure scoring effort of the year.

UConn out-rebounded the Gamecocks 33-30 with 24 on the defensive end. The Huskies shot 56.5% (35-for-62) from the field, holding South Carolina to just 36.7% (18-for-49). The Gamecocks also shot just 33.3% (4-for-12) from behind the arc.

South Carolina committed 22 turnovers as the Huskies took advantage, scoring 28 points off those mistakes. UConn also dominated inside with 56 of its 77 points coming from in the paint. The Huskies' 77 points in today's win matched its lowest single-game effort this season.

HARTFORD, Conn. (December 31, 2008) – Senior Renee Montgomery moved past Cathy Bochain and Jennifer Rizzotti into 12th place on the UConn all-time scoring list with a game-high 20 points to lead the No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team to a 78-41 win over Hartford at the XL Center on Wednesday afternoon.

Despite missing their first five shots of the game, the Huskies got on the board first at the 18:21 mark as Montgomery connected on a jumper outside the key. The only tied score of the afternoon came 24 seconds later as Hartford's Erica Beverly knotted the score at two. Another Montgomery basket gave the Huskies their second lead of the game as UConn continued to go on a 12-0 run in a span of three minutes to take control of the game.

Montgomery's 20 points all came in the first half as she led all scorers at the break while UConn shot 62.2% (23-for-37) from the field. Hartford struggled early as they shot 19.4% (6-for-31) in the first frame, including a 12.5% (1-for-8) showing from behind the arc.

The Huskies finished today's contest shooting 55.7% (34-for-61) and held the Hawks to just 26.8% (15-for-56) from the floor. Tina Charles finished with her 10th double-figure scoring effort of the season as she scored 17 points and pulled down nine rebounds as all 11 UConn players who saw action in today's contest scored at least one point.

After today's win, UConn continues to hold the nation's longest active streak of 30 consecutive regular-season home victories and put the Huskies at 10-0 all-time against Hartford and a perfect 8-0 when playing the Hawks at home.

Today's contest marked the 11th game this season and 84th of her career in which Montgomery scored in double-figures. Sophomore Maya Moore's 11 points marked her 13th straight game in double-digits and the 48th of her career. Moore also grabbed eight rebounds while picking up one steal and two blocks on the afternoon.

Hartford freshman Illicia Mathis recorded a team-high 10 points as the Hawks limited the UConn transition offense, holding the Huskies to just 10 fast break points, all in which came in the first half of play. But the Huskies used 15 points off Hartford turnovers and 40 in the paint to earn the win and open the season 12-0 for the third straight year and the 10th time in 13 seasons.

(January 3, 2009) – Senior Renee Montgomery scored 21 points, including 10 in a critical 18-3 run during a span of seven minutes in the second half, to turn a 43-41 lead into a convincing 76-63 victory for the No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team over LSU at the XL Center on Saturday afternoon.

Montgomery's 21 points led five players in double figures for the Huskies (13-0), marking the sixth time this season in which five or more players have scored in double-digits. Montgomery is just the third player in UConn history to score 1,500 points and notch 500 assists following Jen Rizzotti and Diana Taurasi.

The Huskies shot 46.4% (32-for-69) in today's contest as Maya Moore recorded her fifth double-double of the season with 17 points and 13 rebounds. Kalana Greene and Kaili McLaren's 10-point performance marked the fourth double-digit scoring effort for both players this season. Junior Tina Charles' 16 points was her 11th game in double-figures this year.

Moore led all scorers at the break with 15 points as she added four assists and three blocks on the afternoon. LSU's four point lead at 18-14 with 12:16 left in the first frame tied UConn's largest deficit of the season. After trailing in the half, UConn took an eight point lead at the half for its largest lead of the half at 41-33.

The Huskies began the second half shooting 1-for-11 in the first 4:49 of the second frame but turned the tempo of the game around as Montgomery sparked the UConn run to take their largest lead of the contest at 17 points with a 63-46 advantage.

LSU, now 6-5 on the year, had four players in double-figure points, led by Allison Hightower with 14 points. The Huskies held the Lady Tigers to 39.7% (23-for-58) shooting from the floor while out-rebounding LSU 76-63.

After today's win, UConn has opened the season 13-0 for the second straight year and eighth time in the last 13 seasons. The Huskies also improve to 206-11 when playing as the nation's No. 1 team in the AP Top-25 poll.

Today's contest marked the 12th game this season and 85th of her career in which Montgomery scored in double-figures. Moore's 17 points marked her 14th straight game in double-digits and the 49th of her career.

TAMPA, Fla. (January 6, 2009) – The No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team forced 26 turnovers and held the Bulls to 11 points in the second half as the Huskies defeated South Florida 83-37 in their BIG EAST Conference opener on Tuesday night in the USF Sun Dome.

Sophomore Maya Moore used 20 first half points to finish with 24 as the Huskies held the nation's leading scoring team, a program in which averages 89.9 points per game, to 37 on the night. The 11 points in the second frame by the Bulls marked the lowest tally given up by the Huskies this season in either half.

With the victory, UConn improves to 14-0 on the year and moves to 7-0 all-time against the Bulls (13-3, 0-2). The win gives UConn a 14-0 record to open the season, marking the second straight year and eighth in 13 years in which the Huskies have earned that feat.

The Huskies took control early led by Moore with 15 points in the first eight minutes of play, including two three-pointers. Senior Renee Montgomery also chipped in with nine points and dished out two assists.

Junior Tina Charles' shot 5-for-9 in the first frame for 12 points as the Huskies cut .474 (18-for-38) to take a 45-26 lead at the break. With that tally, UConn snapped its streak in which it has shot over .500 in the opening half at six games this season.

The Huskies held South Florida without a point for the first 4:36 in the second half as they went on a 9-0 run to open up play after the break. The UConn run was sparked by four points from Charles who finished the night with 17 for her 12th game in double-figure points this season and the 63rd of her career. She also pulled down 12 rebounds, recording her fourth double-double of the season.

The Bulls shot just .095 (2-for-21) from behind the arc in tonight's match-up, a team in which averages nine made three-pointers per contest. UConn also forced 26 turnovers from the Bulls, including 13 first half tallies for 17 UConn points off those mistakes.

In the second half, UConn out-scored the home team 35-11 and out-rebounded the Bulls 54-36 to take the BIG EAST Conference victory. The Bulls shot .246 (15-for-61) from the field as they recorded 56 points below their average.

After today's win, UConn has now won 116 of its last 124 BIG EAST Conference games as the Huskies extend their regular-season winning streak to 22 games.

MORGANTOWN, W. Va. (January 10, 2009) – Senior Renee Montgomery scored 17 of her 28 points in the first half to lead the No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team over West Virginia 85-53 in BIG EAST Conference action on Saturday night in the WVU Coliseum.

Montgomery's 28 points moves her past Swin Cash into 10th place on the UConn career scoring list with her current total of 1,603 as she recorded her 13th game with double-figure points this season. She joins Svetlana Abrosimova and Shea Ralph as the only players in UConn history to rank among the program's top-10 in scoring, steals and assists.

With the victory, UConn improves to 20-1 all-time against the Mountaineers (10-5, 0-3) as the Huskies have won the last 20 meetings between the two programs. UConn also moves to a perfect 15-0 overall and 2-0 in the BIG EAST this season, while the Huskies extend their regular-season winning streak to 23 consecutive games.

UConn began tonight's game controlling the tempo early, while dominating on both ends of the court to take a quick 23-5 lead just six minutes in as Montgomery hit her second three pointer of the half to give the Huskies the 18-point lead. She led all scorers at the break with 17 points, shooting 6-for-9 from the floor, while adding three assists and two steals.

The Huskies controlled play in the paint throughout the game, out-rebounding West Virginia 43-31, including a 21-11 advantage in the first half. In the first frame the Huskies also picked up 26 points in paint as the Mountaineers scored just eight. UConn outscored West Virginia 38-25 in the second half to take away the convincing BIG EAST victory as they shot 47.8% (11-for-23) from the field, including 72.2% (13-for-18) from the free throw line in the half. West Virginia shot 30.3% (10-for-33) from the floor in the half, while getting just six attempts from the charity stripe in the second half.

Maya Moore finished the game with 16 points as she recorded her 16th straight game in double-figure scoring and the 51st of her career. The sophomore also pulled down 10 rebounds for her sixth double-double of the year.

Hayes contributed with 10 points, five rebounds and three assists as the Huskies shot 53.6% (30-for-56) on the night, while picking up 42 points in the paint.

Junior Tina Charles and freshman Caroline Doty both added eight points, respectively, as Charles recorded nine rebounds. With her efforts, Charles moves past Kris Lamb into 25th place on the UConn career scoring list with her current total of 1,247.
